

THE ELBA REEF IS NOW CLOSER THAN EVER!

We are proud to present you a new diving safari route in Red Sea.

Elba Reef is a unique and almost undiscovered place on the border of Sudan, where you can hardly see any other vessels. The area is far from the traditional marinas used by safari boats. Therefore, we depart from the port of Hamata (100 km south from Marsa Alam).

Why Elba?

Elba Reef is located at the Halaib Triangle on the Egyptian and Sudanese border with very nice plateaus on its North and South sides. It is a triangle-shaped reef. The plateau in the North is long and starts at around 20 m and ends at around 45 m depth.

Coral reef with its abundance of species and untouched nature is breathtaking.

On The eastern reef of the Elba region you can find the wreck of Levanzo. 110 m long vessel sank in 1923 and lies at a depth of 22-65 m.

Privacy guaranteed, as only a few ships visit the Elba area per year.

We are sure, that Elba will surprise even the most experienced Red Sea safari veterans!

The route would be as follows:

Trip starts and ends in Hamata (4,5 h by bus from Hurghada).

1. Day: check dive in Fury Soal area (Satya for example) followed by two dives in St. John's area (or Rocky, Zabargad).
Overnight crossing to Elba.
2. Day Elba
3. Day Elba
4. Day Elba, Abu Fandera
5. St. John area
6. Fury Soal and Hamata marina

Safari includes 3-4 night dives and all together 18-19 dives.
Just one 10 hours overnight sailing on first night.
